

RYE BOWLS CLUB

First Founded in 1897 – Reformed in 1982

CLUB RULES

- [1] **Name:** The Club shall be called “Rye Bowls Club” hereafter called the Club
- [2] **Object:** The object of the Club shall be to promote and foster the game of bowls, to encourage and provide for the social enjoyment of its members.
- [3] **The Rules of Play:** The Rule of Play for all matches shall be those of The English Bowling Association and, where appropriate, The Sussex County Bowling Association and be binding on all players at all times.
- [4] **Club Committee:** The Committee shall consist of (1) Chairman, (2) Vice-Chairman, (3) Hon. Secretary, (4) Treasurer, (5) Fixtures Secretary, (6) Club Captain, (7) Club Vice-Captain, (8) Ladies Captain, (9) Ladies Vice-Captain, (10) Press Officer, (11) Catering Manager, (12) Ground and Clubhouse Facilitator, (13) President ex officio. These officers to be elected at the AGM for a period of one year only. They are eligible for re-election annually. Any person can be nominated for more than one position on the Committee. Elected Officers shall not, by reason of their position, have any pecuniary gain or paid position in the Club. The Club Committee shall be responsible for the day to day running of the Club functions. They may delegate any of these functions to individual members of the Committee as they see fit. The Committee shall meet at least five times a year, with any five members making a quorum. At any such Meeting the Chairman, or person elected chair for that meeting, shall have the casting vote in relation to any matter not relating to that position. Committee members failing to attend at least two meetings within their year of office shall be deemed to have resigned from the Committee unless a valid reason is given and accepted by the Committee. The Committee shall have the power to form sub-committees as and when necessary and those committees may co-opt club members having special skills to serve on such committees provided that the number of co-opted members does not form a majority. All resolutions of that sub-committee shall be referred to the Club Committee for ratification.
- [5] **Membership:** There shall be three classes of membership as follows:-
- (a) Non playing members will pay an annual membership fee, agreed by the Committee. This will not entitle them to play bowls for the Club at all, nor be allowed to hold office or have any voting rights; neither will they be entitled to any share of the Club funds or property in the event of the dissolution of the Club.
- (b) A person who pays the full annual membership fee only, may enter for the Club team games and competitions, on payment of the current green fees on each occasion that they use the green.
- (c) A person who pays the full annual membership and the current annual green fee may enter for Club team games and competitions and may use the green at any time that it is officially open without further payment.
- Both class (b) and (c) members are eligible to hold office and have full voting rights.

CLUB RULES

- [6] **Eligibility for Membership:** To become a member of Rye Bowls Club a person must complete and submit an application form to the Committee who will ratify and approve the application. Details of new applicants will be posted on a Club notice-board for not less than seven days from the time of the application. During this period any current member may notify any objections to membership being confirmed by advising a committee member in writing of the reasons for objection. At the next committee meeting immediately following the seven day rule the Committee will determine whether membership should be confirmed. A simple majority of the votes cast will be sufficient to confirm membership. Their decision will be final and binding upon all members. Once membership is confirmed the applicant will be required to pay the current annual membership fee as agreed at an AGM. Membership can only commence once the Treasurer has received payment of the fees.
- [7] **Fees:** (a) Annual club membership to be paid by October 1st.
(b) Playing season tickets for the year paid by 31st May. The Committee may declare any member in default of payment of either (a) or (b) to have ceased membership. The Committee shall have the power to re-admit any such person to membership upon such term as it thinks fit.
- [8] **Honorary Membership:** Honorary membership (Life or Vice President) may be granted to persons who have rendered exceptional service to the Club, or who, by their special position in the community, are deemed to be suitable for such membership. Nominations for such membership shall be offered by the committee and ratified by a simple majority at an AGM or EGM.
- [9] **Annual General Meeting:** The Club shall hold an AGM in the month of November each year for the following purposes:-
- (a) To receive from the Committee an annual report and statement of accounts for the preceding year.
 - (b) To elect the Officers of the Committee
 - (c) To appoint a suitable checker or checkers of the annual accounts, who must not be a Committee member.
 - (d) To decide upon any resolution which may be submitted to the meeting in accordance with the laid-down procedure.
 - (e) To deal with any special matter which the Committee may desire to bring before the members and receive suggestions from members for consideration by the Committee.
 - (f) To determine the Annual Membership fee.

Nominations for the Officers and Committee may be entered on the list posted on the Clubhouse notice board no less than twenty eight days before the date the season ends. All nominees must agree to their names going forward and must be regularly proposed and seconded. Further nominations may be accepted provided the nominee is present and meets all the foregone criteria. All paid up members are entitled to attend any AGM or EGM and to receive in writing the agenda, date and time of the meeting at least fourteen days prior to the meeting.

CLUB RULES

- [10] **Extraordinary General Meeting:** An EGM may be called by (a) the Committee (b) The District Council (c) 25% of the voting membership, giving notice to the Committee in writing, setting forth the specific business for such a meeting. The Committee will call such a meeting within one month of written request and members will be notified of this meeting and its business. Members who are liable to be absent may vote by post, but the vote must be received by the Hon Secretary prior to the meeting. Each member shall have one vote with a simple majority passing a resolution or an election of an officer. The Chairman or in his/her absence Vice-Chairman shall have the casting vote.
- [11] **Accounts:** The Treasurer shall keep proper accounts and shall present them to the Committee quarterly as required. The bank balances shall be reported at each Committee meeting. Annual accounts shall be prepared to 30th September and submitted to a checker or checkers in accordance with rule 9 (c). These annual accounts to be presented at the AGM for acceptance by the members. A bank account shall be opened in the name of the Club and cheques or withdrawals to be authorised by any two or three signatories. These shall be the Treasurer and any two other nominated Committee members, none of whom shall be related. No expenditure in excess of £100 may be incurred without having previously been agreed by the Committee.
- [12] **Complaints:** Members having complaints should take them to the senior member of the committee present at that time, who should deal with them if possible. All complaints must be reported to the Committee. Within twenty eight days of receiving a written complaint the Club shall hold a meeting of the complaints sub-committee, comprising Chairman, Club/Mens Captain, Club/Ladies Captain and Secretary. All parties to the complaint shall have the right to attend the complaints hearing and bring relevant witnesses if necessary. In the event of a dispute over the decision of the Complaints sub-committee, the Committee shall appoint an appeals sub-committee which will consist of Vice-Chairman and three other members of the Committee that had not considered the original complaint. The appeals sub-committee ruling will be final.
- [13] **Suspension:** Any member can be suspended for a specified period for:-
- (a) Misconduct within the confines of the property known as Rye Bowls Club
 - (b) Bringing the game or the Club into disrepute.
- Should a suspension be for a year or longer, the Committee shall first consider any re-application for membership.
- [14] **Visitors:** All visitors shall pay green fees in advance and abide by Club rules
- [15] **Property:** Any property of the Club shall not be removed from the precincts of the Club without permission of a member of the Committee.
- [16] **Notices:** No notices shall be displayed on the Club notice-board unless previously authorised by a member of the Committee.
- [17] **Constitution:** No alteration of or addition to the Constitution of the Club shall be made, except by giving 14 days' notice, in writing, either prior to an AGM or EGM. Such alterations shall be included in the notice of any such meeting.
